

Activity I EMPTY OR FULL?


Let's have fun with a balloon and find out!



Fix the balloon to a water tap and hold it there.




Now slowly open the tap and fill the balloon with water.




Take a small ballloon.


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Our Mission: Every child reading well and for fun!

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10% of the net proceeds from the sale of these books goes to support reading and life long learning programmes for underprivileged children.



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








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
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
















