

One of his little cousins asked him in a scared voice, "What is it? We have never seen anything like it!"


Kuttan smiled wisely and cleared his throat, "Mrrowurr.


Of course, I know! What a question!"




Last year he had seen the same thing and Ma Cat had explained it to him. But he had forgotten everything.

"Happiness!" he exclaimed.


"Happiness?" the kittens asked doubtfully.


"Yes. Don't you understand? They look so pretty waving in the breeze. All that green stuff makes us happy. Right?


The people are also happy when they see the leaves come up.
