Fish Finger Puppets - Flash Fiction

Now that you've heard/read the story, it's time to create your own!

Using the statement, "I was once walking through a forest and in the river I saw...." build your flash fiction!

Flash fiction is a short story form that ranges from about 5 to 1500 words. We will attempt writing a flash fiction of about 100 words.

Prompts-



Draw a fictional character (a sea animal, a bird or something completely different) on the finger puppet template Write the name of your character underneath your drawing, colour it, let your imagination flow!

You could create more than one character

We have created our character named Sol!

2. Creating Puppets:

Cut the characters out across the borders and paste the two corners as per the size of your fingers.

3.) The Story:

Within your flash fiction, you are to mention the following mandatory objects within your story-

a. A Golden Box, b. Plastic Bottle, c. Seashells, d. Fishing Net

Think about the situation where you are walking through a forest and you spot a river! what happens next. Let your imagination flow and build a fictional story mentioning the 4 'mandatory objects' mentioned above.

- a. How is the river supporting other life forms?
- b. How do you visualize the river?
- c. Are there any humans near the river? If yes, what are they doing?









We will be using each letter of our chosen word, like the beginning of a new word to form our poems! We chose **CLOUD**

Now, move on to each letter and write a word that you can think of with that letter.

Since we chose **CLOUD**, therefore,

O- Outside

U- Unique

And that's seriously bad news for our friends beneath the waves...


Over 700 species of marine animals have been reported to have eaten or been entangled in plastic - and scientists think that the amount of plastic in the ocean may triple by 2050!




2. It makes us feel anxious, how does this make you feel? Draw your emotion below -

Animals, birds, and fish can get trapped, tangled, and even strangled by all kinds of plastic waste. Waste such as discarded fishing nets, old plastic bottles, polythene bags can be harmful. They also mistake small bits of plastic, such as bottle caps and wrappers, for food and eat them up making them sick with their stomachs swollen.

Centering


