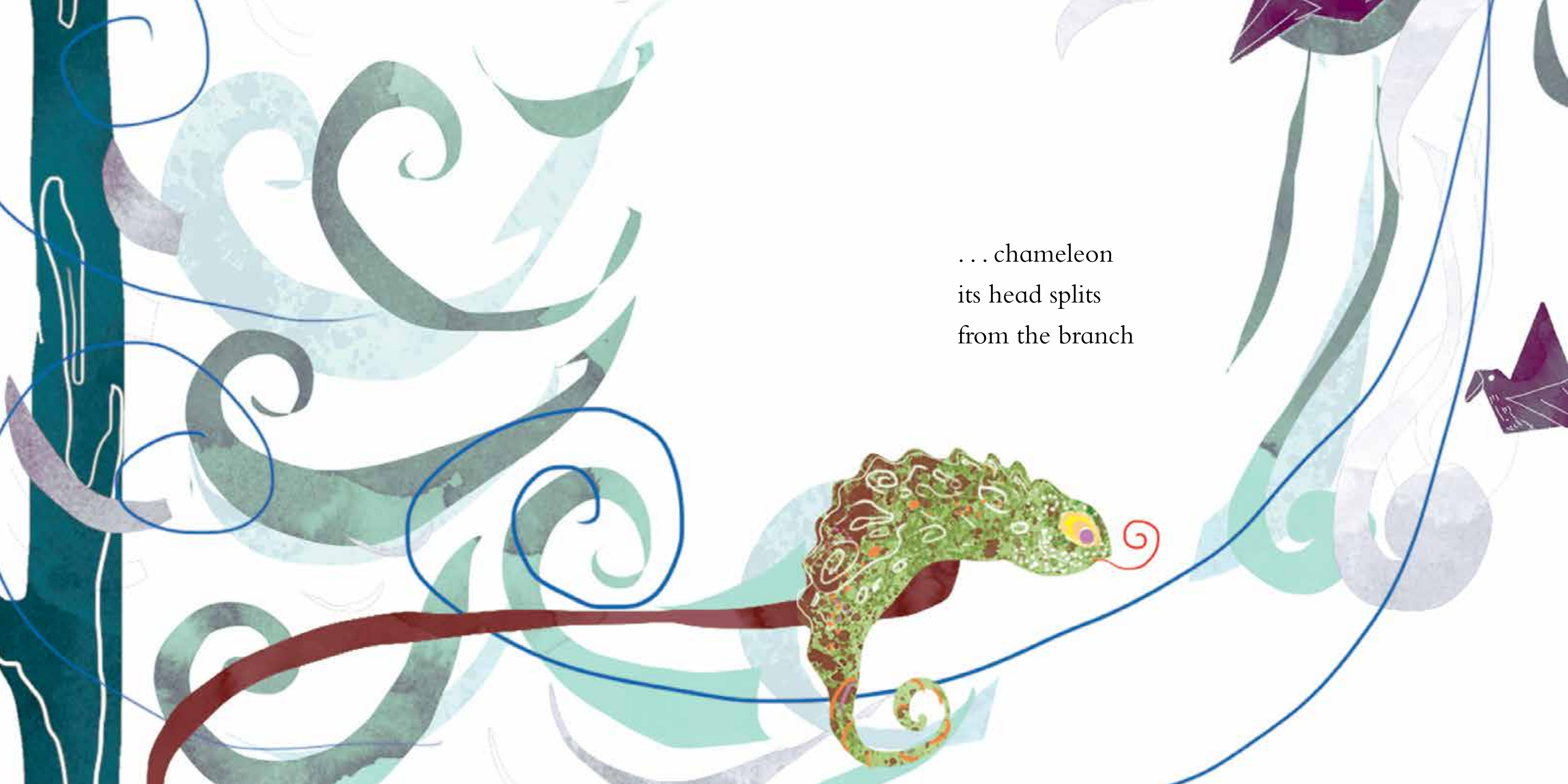



morning rush
