That night, as a thin, friendly moon peeped into Shanno's house, it saw her sitting on her charpai, cutting paper.









That's what had helped Shanno make a hundred elephants all in one night!






Well, I saw one flying in the sky the other day. Haven't you?




Fun Facts!

An elephant can weigh anywhere between 3-5 tons!






Elephants flap their ears to keep themselves cool.
