




The rain had stopped. Cold and scared, the camel left the village.

**Vyankatesh Madgulkar** (1927-2001) was one of the most popular and well-known Marathi writers of his time. He also wrote several folk plays. He attempted a Marathi version of Fiddler on the Roof. He translated books, especially wild life books, from English to Marathi. He wrote essays on his travels, nature and interesting people he had read about, like Richard Burton, the British traveller
