If you're a dog or a cat, I'm your best bet to keep clean. Or say if you're a chameleon, frog or anteater, I jump out and catch your insect-food for you! **2** A chameleon's tongue is twice as long as its body.

A giraffe has a bluishpurple tongue that's fiftythree centimetres long, super tough and covered with bristly hair. This helps the giraffe eat the thorny Acacia tree leaves.





A woodpecker's tongue can wrap around its skull and is barbed and sticky to help them extract bugs from holes.
